The report explores the feasibility of providing a trial weekend burial service (Saturdays only) for a period of six months, There are currently no plans to trial burials on either Sunday's or Bank Holiday's, although this could be considered at a later date if the Saturday service proves to be successful.

1. <u>Executive Summary</u>

The Council has been requested to extend interment times to include Saturdays, Sundays and Bank Holidays which would allow differing faith groups to bury the deceased within the parameter of religious/cultural customs.

The report explores the feasibility of providing a trial weekend burial service (Saturdays only) for a period of six months, There are currently no plans to trial burials on either Sunday's or Bank Holiday's, although this could be considered at a later date if the Saturday service proves to be successful.

2. <u>Recommendations</u>

That the Portfolio Holder for Community Safety and Regulatory Services consider the following:

A six month pilot scheme to offer a limited service for burials (one earth burial service plus one further burial chamber burial if requested) to take place on Saturday's at Norse Road cemetery.

The charge for the interment fee for Saturday burials would be based on the standard fee (applied during the working week) plus the additional fee of £455.00 to cover costs.

3. <u>Reasons for Recommendations</u>

Currently the limited data available indicates that demand for this service would be low however certain parts of the Bedford community have said that they would welcome this service. A trial period will allow the level of demand to be accurately determined so that a more informed decision can be taken on whether or not the extended service would be feasible.

4. Key Implications

(a) <u>Policy</u>

The Council has the discretion to determine whether to provide a higher service level than is currently operated for burials, based on the needs of the service and its users.

(b) <u>Legal</u>

The provision of cemeteries is a discretionary Local Authority service. The current Bedford Borough Council Cemetery Regulations 2005, made to ensure the proper management, regulation and control of cemeteries (Local Authority Cemetery Order 1977), permit burials during the normal working week, i.e. Monday to Friday. The notice of interment is required at least two working days prior to the burial. If interments are permitted outside these times the cemetery regulations will need amendment.

This six month trail "Saturday burials" has been discussed with the Institute of Cemetery and Crematorium Management who have agreed for the Council to gather the results of the trial and then if this is to be made a permanent service then the Cemetery regulations will need to be taken to the Councils Executive Committee for approval.

The Council would be required to have staff available on a Saturday to ensure the following legislation is complied with if the proposal to offer Saturday burials was provided:

- a. Births and Death Act 1926 requires the person disposing of the body to deliver the Registrar's certificate for disposal or the Coroner's Order for burial to the cemetery. Failure to do so is an offence.
- b. The Local Authority Cemetery Order 1977 (LACO 1977) places a number of duties on cemetery operators. They are summarised as follows:
 - i. Identify the correct grave for interment.
 - ii. Ensure the depth of interment is compliant with LACO 1977.
 - iii. The identity of the deceased is ascertained from disposal certificate and coffin plate.
 - iv. The grave is backfilled on the day of the interment.
 - v. The death is registered as soon as reasonably practical in the Register of Burials.

Bedford Borough Council has harmonised pay and employment conditions to ensure fair and consistent arrangements for all employees. As a result the Council has reviewed all employees in roles which fall under the National Joint Council for Local Government Services Conditions of Service and Joint Negotiating Committee for Local Authority Craft and Associated

Employees with the exception of those employed in schools. This review covered weekend working both as overtime and as part of the normal working week together with call out/standby payments for staff.

Legal advice has been obtained regarding the equality implications of this proposal. As a result it will not be possible to ringfence Saturday services for only religious reasons. Therefore this trail service adjustment will be available to anyone who wishes to request it.

(c) <u>Resource Implications</u>

Given the relatively small number of staff within Bereavement Services and Cemetery Grounds Maintenance, consideration will need to be given to additional pressures placed on existing staff.

The following costs associated with providing Saturday burials are based on existing salary costs, with any estimates based on current HR policies regarding overtime payments together with administration overheads of providing this service at the weekend. Therefore full costs would be recovered if a request was made for this service at the weekend.

Costs are based upon one member of Bereavement Services staff and 2 members of Grounds Maintenance staff being available on a Saturdays. The charge for the interment fee would be based on the standard fee plus the additional costs of £455.00.

Saturday Supplement

Additional charge for Saturday Interments (outside of standard operational hours- Monday to Friday) will be set at £455.00.

(d) <u>Risk Implications</u>

There is a risk that an on call Saturday burial service may not be able to be provided every weekend and would be subject to staffing levels and staff availability.

As there no standby fee is offered, there is a risk that when a request comes in for an interment on a Saturday staff may not be willing to carry it out due to alternative commitments having already been made. This would have a negative impact on the service due to the community being let down.

There is a further risk that as a consequence of allowing Saturday burials that Sunday and Bank Holiday burials may also be requested and also a weekend cremation service. Unless the present staffing resource is increased the Council would find it

difficult to meet such requests. Furthermore these additional costs would need to be added to all burials/ cremations across the week. .

There is a risk that should the available services be fully booked requests for Saturday services may have to be refused leading to the Council receiving complaints particularly if a request for burial under religious grounds has had to be refused.

(e) Environmental Implications

There are no environmental implications arising from this report.

(f) Equalities Impact

An Equalities Impact Assessment has been completed and is included in the Appendices to this report.

5. Details

The pilot scheme would offer one earth burial on a Saturday (a request will be dealt with strictly in the order in which they arrive) as long as the Council have received notification of the request by no later than 4pm the day before and that the required death registration procedure has been complied with. A further burial chamber burial could also be accommodated on a Saturday subject to the same requirements. Requests for burials in reserved graves could not be guaranteed to be accommodated if the reserved grave could not be accessed by the necessary plant/machinery to facilitate the digging of the grave.

Research undertaken regarding burials for out of hours indicate there were approximately 31 requests for burials during weekend/bank holidays over the last five years. This figure is equivalent to an average of 6 requests per year. A previous trial of weekend burials at Norse Road took place in 1999, the outcome of the trial resulted in zero requests over a six month period.

Benchmarking of other Local Authorities

A benchmarking exercise of other Local Authorities has been carried out as part of this review, the key results and comparator authorities have been summarised below regarding the activity of burial, including the interment fees for weekend burials:

Views from Local Funeral Directors (FDs)

Views were sought with the principal local Funeral Directors (FDs) regarding the necessity and need for weekend burials in the Bedford Borough locality.

The views of the FDs suggest that they do not recognise the need or demand for the provision of weekend burials in Bedford. Concern was also expressed in terms of their staffing level to provide the service and the additional costs that would be involved if this was the case.

Other Council services

Currently the proposal for a Saturday burial service should not impact upon Registration Services as they will be able to complete their legal requirement to register the death on a Friday during normal working hours. This does presume that an available appointment is available on that Friday. The service will seek to support the pilot by taking steps design to retain a Friday appointment up to the day concerned. The impact of these steps on other customers and the timeliness of registrations will need to be evaluated during the pilot. In addition, if there were demand for registration of a death after normal working hours on a Friday and on a Saturday to allow a burial to take place on the Saturday this would be an additional cost to the registration service and would need to be scoped accordingly.

Consultation has taken place with local Funeral Directors with regards to possibility of arranging burials at weekends. Certain faith groups – Muslim and Jewish state within their beliefs that burial should take place as soon as possible after death. Therefore requests could be received for a burial to take place within 24 hours of death. If death occurs late on a Friday, Bereavement Services are unable to offer a burial service until the next available working day which could be some 72 hours after death.

The pilot scheme will provide accurate data on the demand for the service and the impact upon staff so a decision can be taken on whether the service is made permanent.

Summary of analysis

In preparing this report, due consideration has been given to the Borough Council's statutory Equality Duty to eliminate unlawful discrimination, advance equality of opportunity and foster good relations, as set out in Section 149(1) of the Equality Act 2010.

In 2011 Census, Bedford had a population of 157,479, out of which 5.5% were Muslim and 0.1% Jewish. Both faith groups require a body to be buried as soon as possible, within 24 hours from death. Both faith groups forbid cremation.

Bereavement Services data show that in the last 5 years, there has been 974 interments take place out of which 9% of burials belonged to the Muslim/Jewish faith groups. The remaining 91% are other religions or persons of no faith.

Statistics show out of the 9% Muslim/Jewish faiths, there were 34% of deaths occurred on a Friday or Saturday, and the Council was unable to accommodate a burial the next day, therefore Bereavement Services are able to offer burials at short notice and are currently able to offer 66% of burials within 24 hours.

Saturday burials cannot be ring-fenced for certain religions only. It should be open to everyone but a policy would be drafted whereby special representations could be made with regards to urgent burials and those with specific religious requests.
